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## Presentations and Transfer Counseling

Presentations will allow students to gain insight on transferring, managing life, and college readiness. Through a student perspective, the presentations will allow community college student to better relate to their peers. The purpose of transfer counseling is to have a one to one conversation with students about their transferring plans or about other questions they might have related to their major, resources offered to transfer students, etc. Students will receive guidance not only about the requirements needed to apply to UC Davis, but also for other universities they would like to attend.

## Aggie Shadow Days

This is a special program that happens several times throughout the academic year for students to experience higher education at UC Davis during a school day. Participants will be paired with an undergraduate student, who ideally will have the same major and/or interests. Participants will have the opportunity to attend upper division classes, study with the UCD student, and follow them throughout their daily routine. This program will also give students a point of contact at the university, whom they can reach out to and ask question or advice in the future. Dates will be provided once confirmed.

## Transfer Weekend

Transfer weekend is an overnight experience offering workshops, student panels, campus tours, and more. This event usually takes place around the beginning of May; further information about the dates will be provided once confirmed. Furthermore, this weekend will facilitate prospective students the transition to a four-year university. Overnight accommodations, food, and activities will be provided. Transportation to UC Davis will not be provided.
